The final morning was spent at the French Postal Museum, where helpfully an English-speaking guide was provided. The visit had been arranged by Douglas Muir in collaboration with Pascal Rabier, Curator of the French Postal Museum. All were struck by the size of the premises and some of the lovely exhibits, but some expressed concern about how little now related to the
